

Bushland Update Term 1

Weeding and Seeding Jobs

This year we will carry out a big revegetation project along the border of the bushland and around the new building, and students have already been busy!

Pre-primary have been weeding fleabane in the playground, and collecting dry leaves for mulch to improve some garden areas near their classrooms.

Lower Primary are making seed bombs with the native seeds collected by students last year, to place in the bushland and garden beds - we hope they will sprout when the rain begins!

Upper Primary used smoke granules and hot water to prepare the seeds for the seed bombs.

Secondary students removed a pepper tree and olive trees to prevent them invading the bushland. They will also help with weeding and planning the revegetation planting for areas disturbed by the construction site.

What next?

The bushland sub-committee is organising hundreds of little baby plants.
